



# ENVIRONMENTAL GUIDANCE FOR WORKING ON SITE



**Surveyors or contractors brought in to carry out work on boats at WPNSA must register with reception on arrival.**

1. Boat owners/contractors must ensure that any work being carried out does not inconvenience other users of the academy.
2. Pressure washing of anti-fouled boats must be carried out over the dedicated 'wash down area' adjacent to the deep water slipway.
3. Anti fouling or hull painting may only be carried out provided a protective sheet is placed on the tarmac/paving under the boat. Boat owners/contractors found to have soiled the tarmac or paving may not be permitted to come on site in future.
4. Take care to avoid any spillage of paint, solvent or antifoulant onto the land or into drains. Please clean up carefully when you have finished and ensure that any scrapings and debris are collected and disposed of appropriately.
5. Waste left on the site can be blown into the water presenting a hazard to marine life so all litter and waste material (including food waste) should be disposed of carefully in an appropriate bin or recycling receptacle. Bins are provided in various locations around the site and are divided into:
  - a. **Recycling** (white) - for plastic bottles, cardboard, paper and cans.
  - b. **General Waste** (blue) – for all other non hazardous waste.
6. **The disposal of all hazardous waste is the responsibility of the boat owner and must be removed from this site. It is illegal to place hazardous waste in general waste bins and anyone found doing so will be escorted from the site.**
